

Application Notes for Jabra Link 400 USB-A/C DECT Adapter and Jabra Engage 55 UC DECT Headset with Avaya Workplace for Mac - Issue 1.0

Abstract

These Application Notes describe the configuration steps required to integrate Jabra Link 400 USB-A/C DECT Adapter and Jabra Engage 55 UC DECT Headset with Avaya Workplace for Mac.

Readers should pay attention to **Section 2**, in particular the scope of testing as outlined in **Section 2.1** as well as any observations noted in **Section 2.2**, to ensure that their own use cases are adequately covered by this scope and results.

Information in these Application Notes has been obtained through DevConnect compliance testing and additional technical discussions. Testing was conducted via the DevConnect Program at the Avaya Solution and Interoperability Test Lab.

1. Introduction

Jabra Link 400 USB-A/C DECT Adapter and Jabra Engage 55 UC DECT Headset is a Mono/Stereo/Convertible headset that allows connection and call control with Avaya Workplace for Mac (hereafter referred to as Avaya Workplace) via the USB interface to the PC. In this compliance test, only Jabra Engage 55 UC DECT Stereo Headset was used since there are similarities between Jabra Engage 55 UC DECT Mono, Stereo, and Convertible models (see **Attachment 1**, Jabra Engage 55 Declaration of Similarity).

With a Jabra Link 400 USB-A/C DECT Adapter and Jabra Engage 55 UC DECT Headset connected to the PC USB interface, users can directly answer/end calls, mute/unmute, hold/resume and adjust volume with Avaya Workplace running on the PC.

2. General Test Approach and Test Results

The interoperability compliance test included feature and serviceability testing. The feature testing focused on placing calls with Avaya Workplace, answering and ending calls using the call control button on Engage 55 UC, and verifying two-way audio. The call types included calls to voicemail, local extensions, and the PSTN. Call hold and resume, mute and un-mute, and volume were also tested.

The serviceability testing focused on verifying the usability of the headset solution after restarting the Avaya Workplace, restarting the PC, power cycling Engage 55 UC, moving the headset out of DECT range, and disconnecting/reconnecting the Link 400 USB dongle to the PC.

DevConnect Compliance Testing is conducted jointly by Avaya and DevConnect members. The jointly-defined test plan focuses on exercising APIs and/or standards-based interfaces pertinent to the interoperability of the tested products and their functionalities. DevConnect Compliance Testing is not intended to substitute full product performance or feature testing performed by DevConnect members, nor is it to be construed as an endorsement by Avaya of the suitability or completeness of a DevConnect member's solution

For the testing associated with these Application Notes, the interface between Avaya systems and endpoints utilized enabled capabilities of TLS/SRTP.

Avaya's formal testing and Declaration of Conformity is provided only on the headsets/handsets that carry the Avaya brand or logo. Avaya may conduct testing of non-Avaya headset/handset to

determine interoperability with Avaya phones. However, Avaya does not conduct the testing of non-Avaya headsets/handsets for: Acoustic Pressure, Safety, Hearing Aid Compliance, EMC regulations, or any other tests to ensure conformity with safety, audio quality, long-term reliability or any regulation requirements. As a result, Avaya makes no representations whether a particular non-Avaya headset will work with Avaya's telephones or with a different generation of the same Avaya telephone.

Since there is no industry standard for handset interfaces, different manufacturers utilize different handset/headset interfaces with their telephones. Therefore, any claim made by a headset vendor that its product is compatible with Avaya telephones does not equate to a guarantee that the headset will provide adequate safety protection or audio quality.

2.1. Interoperability Compliance tests

All test cases were performed manually. The following features were verified:

- Placing calls to the voicemail system. Voice messages were recorded and played back to verify that the playback volume and recording level were good.
- Placing calls to internal extensions to verify two-way audio.
- Placing calls to the PSTN to verify two-way audio.
- Answering and ending calls using the call button on the headset and the soft button on Avaya Workplace.
- Using the hold button on the headset and the soft button on Avaya Workplace to hold and resume the audio.
- Using the volume buttons on the headset to adjust the audio volume.
- Using the mute button on the headset and the soft button on Avaya Workplace to mute and un-mute the audio.
- Verifying incoming call notification on the headset.
- Verifying call ended notification on the headset
- Verifying ringback notification on the headset.

The serviceability testing focused on verifying the usability of the headset solution after restarting Avaya Workplace, restarting the PC, power cycling Engage 55 UC, moving Engage 55 UC out of DECT range and disconnecting/reconnecting the Link 400 USB dongle to the PC.

2.2. Test Results

All test cases completed successfully with the following observation.

• When Engage 55 UC headset volume is changed, the macOS volume popup shows the volume synchronization to default values when calls drop. This change is slow to occur. This is a known problem and will be addressed in the next Link 400 USB dongle firmware release.

3. Reference Configuration




Figure 1: Test Configuration

Figure 1 illustrates the test configuration used to verify Jabra Engage 55 UC DECT Stereo Headset with Avaya Workplace. Avaya Workplace was installed on the PC. The Jabra Engage 55 UC DECT Stereo Headset communicates via Link 400 USB-C dongle connected to the PC hosting Avaya Workplace. Note that the headset is connected to Link 400 USB dongle via DECT (not shown in the diagram).

5. Configure Avaya Aura® Session Manager


5.1. Add SIP User

The addition of SIP User will not be detailed here. Refer to details in adding user in the administration document for Avaya Aura® Session Manager in [2] listed in **Section 11** for details.

6. Configure Avaya Workplace Client for MAC

Avaya Workplace is a SIP soft phone application that provides users with access to Unified Communications (UC) services. This section shows how to configure Engage 55 UC headset to interoperate with Avaya Workplace. Before configuring the Avaya Workplace, the headset has to be configured and paired as in **Section 8** first.

Log in to Avaya Workplace with a valid SIP user. From Avaya Workplace, navigate to **Settings** → **User Preferences** → **Audio/Video**.



Select entries containing *Jabra Link 400* (the ringer is optional).

7. Configure Jabra Engage 55 UC DECT Headset Environment

This section covers the steps to integrate Engage 55 UC with Avaya Workplace, including:

- Installing Jabra Direct software
- Connecting the Jabra headset

Note: After successfully performing this procedure, Engage 55 UC will be detected in Avaya Workplace as described in **Section 7**.


7.1. Install Jabra Direct Software

Jabra Direct software can be obtained from the Jabra support portal at https://www.jabra.com/support/. Installation of the software is done through executing the setup file and following the prompts.


7.2. Connect the Jabra Headset

Plug Link 400 USB dongle in a USB port of the PC. Link 400 USB dongle has two models, i.e., USB-A and USB-C. In this compliance test, USB-C for Link 400 USB dongle is used. Power up Engage 55 UC. Link 400 USB dongle should be paired with Engage 55 UC out of the box. If not, refer to [4] for pairing instructions.

Open the Jabra Direct application. Select the **Device** icon on the left side of the window. The window should display both Engage 55 UC and Link 400 USB dongle. The Engage 55 UC headset shows *Paired with Jabra Link 400*.



Click on the **Settings** icon on the left side of the window. Under **Softphone Integration**, select *Avaya Equinox* if not already selected.



8. Verification Steps

This section provides steps to verify that the Jabra solution has been successfully integrated with Avaya Workplace.

- Make calls from and to Avaya Workplace and verify two-way audio using Engage 55 UC headset
- Make a call to Avaya Workplace by answering and ending the call using Engage 55 UC headset controls.
- Make a call and verify mute can be initiated from Engage 55 UC headset.
- Make a call and verify Avaya Workplace puts the caller on hold when initiated from Engage 55 UC headset.

9. Conclusion

These Application Notes describe the configuration steps required to integrate Jabra LINK 400 USB-A/C DECT Dongle and Engage 55 UC DECT headset with Avaya Workplace for Mac. All test cases were completed successfully.

Jabra Engage 55 -Declaration of Similarity

It is hereby declared:

Jabra Engage 55 products consist of a DECT adapter and relevant headset. Jabra Engage 55 use the headset models (with model WHB051HS for Stereo/Mono, WHB050HS for Convertible), and a USB DECT adapter, to create the package.

Engage 55 adapter supports USB connection to a PC running a soft client such as Avaya Workplace Client for MacOS. The Engage 55 adapter has LED light for indication of, including incoming call, answer, end, and mute. This functionality is the same when connected to the Engage 55 Stereo, Mono, and Convertible headsets.

The Engage 55 Stereo, Mono, and Convertible headsets use identical firmware.

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
